Counselor's Corner

Safer Smarter Kids

<u>PK and Kindergarten</u> students will learn the difference between Safe and Unsafe Secrets. A Safe Secret is one that is eventually told and that makes everyone happy. An Unsafe Secret is one that makes you feel confused, "icky," or scared and that you are told not to share. Students will learn that when confronted with an Unsafe Secret, it is important to tell someone in their Trusted Triangle or a Grown-Up Buddy as soon as possible.


<u>First Grade</u> students will learn the difference between tattling and reporting. Reporting is something that involves a threat to safety, while tattling is a complaint about someone else's behavior that doesn't involve safety. If children are unsure if a situation is safe or unsafe, they should always report it to a Grown-Up Buddy until they get the 2 H's: Heard and Helped.

Helping Your Child Learn Patience

Learning patience takes time; even as adults some of us are still learning to be more patient. The following are tips to help your child(ren) learn how to be more patient.

- 1. **Ride out emotions.** Acknowledge their feelings...all feelings are okay and negative emotions will eventually dissipate.
- 2. **Go long-term.** Participate in activities with your child(ren) that take time to complete such as a puzzle.
- 3. Embrace nature. The growing process of flowers and vegetables cannot be rushed.
- 4. **Reward savings**. If your child saves their allowance or chore money, giving them a bit extra is like earning "interest" and they will begin to learn they can purchase something larger or more valuable if they delay their gratification and not spend right away.
- 5. **Lead the way.** Be a role model by managing your own desire for instantaneous gratification.

Just a few things to mention as we get closer to the end of the year:

- 1. Every child residing in Indiana who is enrolled in an accredited school must be immunized by the first day of the Academic Year of 2023-2024 as determined by the Indiana State Department of Health (SEA461). Those who aren't in compliance may be putting their child at risk for exclusion. Immunizations can be scheduled through your physician or through the Health Department by
- calling 574-223-2881 for those who are underinsured, uninsured, or who are Medicaid patients.
- 2. All incoming Kindergartner's health forms must be returned prior to the first day of school starting. We advise you to start scheduling the physical, dental, and eye exams early so they may be completed. Problems in any area can affect your child's learning ability. This will also allow the nurse to review your child's medical concerns and ensure your child's teachers are knowledgeable with your child's needs prior to the first day of school. You may drop the completed forms off at Columbia Elementary or mail them to Columbia Elementary Attn: Nurse Ropp 1502 Elm Street,
- 3. Reminders will be sent out for any students that have medications, supplies, or clothing in the nurse's office by May 3rd. This is to remind parents that your child has these items in the nurse's office and will need to be picked up by a parent.
